


Brick Stitch Pattern Native American Style Seed Bead Earrings with Fringe

- 1. Begin by creating a foundation row of beads.** To do this, thread a needle with a length of thread and knot the end. Pick up a size 11/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the bead and pull the thread tight to create a loop. Pick up another size 11/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the second bead and pull the thread tight to create a second loop. Continue adding beads to the foundation row until it is the desired length.
- 2. Start the brick stitch pattern.** To do this, pick up a size 15/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the first loop of the foundation row. Pick up another size 15/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the second loop of the foundation row. Continue adding beads to the brick stitch pattern until you have reached the end of the foundation row.
- 3. Turn the work and start the next row.** To do this, pick up a size 11/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the first loop of the previous row. Pick up another size 11/0 bead and thread it onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the second loop of the previous row. Continue adding beads to the brick stitch pattern until you have reached the end of the row.

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
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4. **Continue beading in the brick stitch pattern until the earrings have reached the desired length.**
5. **Create the fringe.** To do this, cut a length of thread and thread it through the last row of beads on one side of the earring. Knot the thread to secure it. Pick up a few size 15/0 beads and thread them onto the needle. Bring the needle back up through the bottom of the last bead on the fringe. Repeat this step until the fringe has reached the desired length.
6. **Repeat steps 5 and 6 to create the fringe on the other side of the earring.**
7. **Attach the earring hooks.** To do this, open the earring hook and thread it through the top loop of the earring. Close the earring hook to secure it.
8. **Repeat steps 1-7 to create the second earring.**

- Use different colors of seed beads to create unique and eye-catching earrings.
- Add charms or beads to the fringe for extra embellishment.
- Experiment with different bead sizes and shapes to create different looks.

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
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
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
