8. **Decrease round 3:** *K2tog, K1* (repeating around the entire round).
9. **Decrease round 4:** *K1, K2tog* (repeating around the entire round).
10. **Cut the yarn, leaving a tail of approximately 6 inches. Pull the tail through the remaining stitches.**
11. **Weave in loose ends.**

Creating the Scarf

1. **Cast on 60 stitches.**
2. **Knit 5 rows.**
3. **Begin the ribbing pattern:** *K1, P1* (where K denotes knit stitch and P denotes purl stitch). Repeat for 10 rounds.
4. **Knit 5 rows.**
5. **Bind off all stitches.**
6. **Weave in loose ends.**

Assembling the Hat and Scarf

1. **Fold the hat in half lengthwise.**
2. **Find the center point of the scarf.**
3. **Align the center point of the scarf with the folded edge of the hat.**

4. **Pin the scarf to the hat, leaving a 1-inch overlap.**
5. **Sew the scarf to the hat using a yarn needle and yarn of your choice.**

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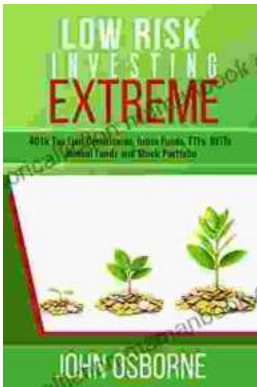
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
