Materials

- 1 yard of fabric
- 1/2 yard of interfacing
- 1 yard of ribbon

- Needle and thread
- Sewing machine

Instructions

1. Cut out the hat pieces from the fabric and interfacing. 2. Sew the interfacing to the wrong side of the fabric. 3. Fold the brim in half and press. 4. Sew the brim to the crown of the hat. 5. Drape the brim over one side of the head and pin it in place. 6. Sew the ribbon around the base of the hat to secure the brim.

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
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
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
